



A Single System for Truck Release

With the release of e-Manifest: Trucks (Release 4), the Automated Commercial Environment (ACE) consolidates and displays legacy and ACE release information in one easy-to-use primary screen, giving U.S. Customs and Border Protection (CBP) Officers a comprehensive view of enforcement and transaction history data. The CBP Officers have point-and-click access to release data from seven separate legacy systems. Pre-sent information from the e-Manifest allows these systems to screen the information before the truck arrives at the border. These systems then send their data to ACE. The primary inspector screen displays all the summary data on a single easy-to-read screen, with additional information available within one to two clicks.

Eliminates Toggling to Allow More Time for Analysis

Consolidating the release data will reduce the time CBP Officers have to spend on administrative paperwork and eliminate the need to toggle between each legacy system. With “one stop” access to release data, officers will have more time to analyze the release information and focus on potential risks through visual observation and questioning.

The First Participating Government Agency is Introduced

The International Trade Data System (ITDS) has taken the first step toward the “Single Window to the Government” by including the first Participating Government Agency in ACE. This first agency, the Federal Motor Carrier Safety Administration, a division of the Department of Transportation, will send up-to-the-minute safety information on trucks crossing the borders to ACE, and will in turn receive accurate and timely statistics.
